Mr. Pachecano is a native San Antonian who grew up working with his father's construction company. He has a Bachelor of Environmental Design degree from Texas A & M University and holds two advanced degrees from Columbia University, namely, an M.S. in Architecture and an M.S. in Real Estate Development with a focus in Sustainable Land Use. Under Roy's leadership, his family-owned firm, Portico Residential LLC, gained national recognition for developing the first LEED Platinum historic dwelling in the United States (Nix House, 1899) located in the King William Historic District of San Antonio. He is on the faculty of Columbia University and the Pratt Institute in New York. He has been a regular guest lecturer on sustainable development at Princeton University.

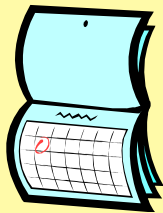
